Dr Raz Mahroof has been a full time Consultant Intensivist and Anaesthetist at Addenbrooke's Cambridge University Hospitals since 2009. He is dual-accredited in Critical Care Medicine and Anaesthesia and trained in Oxford, University College Hospital London and Southampton. He is PI for two national pandemic trials and is the Anaesthetic Lead for FABULAS and WAVE trials. He is the regional lead for flu pandemic research (dormant) and has completed his role as the Lead for the UK National Emergency Laparotomy Audit. Since 2010, he has been the Lead for clinical governance on ICU.

Raz's specialist anaesthetic interests are in provision of anaesthesia for major orthopaedic surgery, in addition to liver, pancreas and biliary surgery. He also leads on anaesthesia for resections of phaeochromocytoma tumours for East Anglia.
