

CHAPEL CHARITIES

At Sunday Evensongs this term, we will be collecting by cash and card to support the work of **UNICEF's Ukraine and Refugee Response Crisis Appeal** and **Médicins Sans Frontières (Doctors Without Borders)**. UNICEF is working to support families and children in need, whether within Ukraine or displaced due to the conflict, with an estimated 27.4 million people in need. Médicins Sans Frontières brings medical teams and hygiene resources to situations of need around the world, and is providing much needed emergency clinics, hygiene kits and drinking water to regions of Pakistan devastated by recent flooding.
